Industry Facts

Changes in the construction management profession are causing more construction professionals to consider a master's degree, as a terminal degree.

Additionally, an increasing number of professional organizations across the nation are beginning to view the master's degree as an entry-level credential for practicing managers. This is currently the situation for construction managers. Several construction management professional organizations, including the Construction Management Association of America, the Construction Financial Management Association, and the American Institute of Constructors are standing behind licensure programs that have advanced education requirements.
